#### Plan Ahead.

Make sure your route passes by a provincial watercraft inspection station.



#### **Stop For Inspections.**

It's the law to stop at every mussel inspection station along your route – and it helps protect our waters.



## Clean. Drain. Dry. Every Time.

This applies to boats, paddleboards, fishing gear, water toys, and lifejackets.



#### **Pull The Plug.**

Drain all bilges, livewells, and water-holding compartments on land – it's the law in B.C.



## **Coming From An Infested Region?**

Consider renting watercraft or gear at your destination to avoid spreading mussels.
